Help With the Call

Age and experience can bring wisdom in God's ways. We find that in our first reading. Eli's eyesight was fading, but not his spiritual insight. Young Samuel, with youthful energy, was ready to jump, but needed Eli's help to understand who was calling. Sometimes discerning a vocation requires help. True then, true now. For those up in years, let's be ready to assist young folk in hearing God's call to a purposeful life, a vocation to live and to love. How? Let them know we see gifts, a potential vocation in them. For the young, yet to discern God's will? A grandparent or someone with years of experience might be just as helpful to you as Eli was to Samuel! That's what the Bible saying! For everyone: How often do I pray "Speak Lord, your servant is listening"? Not a bad way to start a prayer time!

Bodies & Temples

Knowing what St Paul was responding to can deepen our appreciation of his message to the Corinthians. Often Paul quotes a local saying or proverb, then offers a corrective. Right before today's excerpt, he quotes 'all things are lawful for me', a Corinthian mistaken understanding of freedom in Christ. He counters by adding 'but not all are beneficial', then proceeds to teach about the holiness of our body. While having a reputation as 'sin city', Corinth was also filled with pagan temples and shrines, so the idea that temples are dwelling places of a God, for sacrifice and prayer, would have been familiar. Starting from there, Paul teaches that our BODY is temple; a dwelling place of the Holy Spirit. We are called to treat it as such. Great insight into making loving, life-giving moral choices!

Sign Me Up

We begin the Ordinary Time of the Church Year with the call of the first disciples. Let's cut to the chase. 'Jesus turned and saw them following him'. Not a quick glance. He saw into them, that they were looking for something, so he asks "what are you looking for?". Jesus looks into us in the same way. The soon to be disciples ask "where are you staying?" "Come and see." This isn't an invitation to a house tour. It is "spend time with me and you will find what you are looking for." They did. We can too. Jesus knows our deepest longings before we do, and knows how to fill them.
