

Dear Parish Families:

One of the joint Pastoral Council goals was to create a single bulletin for the two parishes within this first year of my service to you. Naturally, this had its challenges. But, because I have such wonderful support staff we will be offering one bulletin for both parishes beginning FEBUARY 18, 2024! That is the first weekend of Lent. Sharon Campbell will become the bulletin creator and editor. Her email is sharon.campbell.dor.org or you can call her at: 585.964.8627 during regular office hours. As we begin this effort, the deadline for submitting articles/items will be need to be adjusted, to start out it will be the Friday a full week before the weekend you wish to have it appear. All ministries, groups and committees will have to plan ahead, as we move forward, we will be able to change the submission deadline.

We are working diligently with the finance office to create an informative and transparent financial section for the bulletin. All events for both churches will be accessible and available for everyone...so this is very exciting! One of the downsides of the shared bulletin is that we will no longer be able to publish the Prayer/Sick List, presently printed in the Nativity Bulletin. There will be limited space in the combined bulletin. It is important for our community to pray for one another. Both Nativity and SEAS presently have Prayer Chain/Groups that pray for intentions that are submitted. Contact information for both will be printed in the bulletin and you are invited to contact either or both. I will invite those who run that ministry to write an article explaining how they disseminate that list. You, of course, know that we have to adhere to HIPPA laws about revealing information and praying for people. They must consent to that and so it does become complicated.

Please be patient with us as we begin to implement the new joint bulletin. I anticipate some growing pains and it will take some time to iron out some of the wrinkles. Sharon will keep us updated on deadlines for articles or events or desired shared information so that nothing falls through the cracks. This is the first real big change and transitions are messy so this gives us an opportunity to practice the virtue of patience!
