## **Dear Parish Family, Happy Easter!**

So, we've come through the great season of Lent and we kind of ride the Easter wave for fifty days! There's a big difference between our Christmas season (which always seems so rushed and short) and Easter. It is no surprise that the Church invites us to celebrate Easter for a longer period than Lent. The celebration is longer than the penitence, as it should be. Easter will culminate in the great Feast of Pentecost the birth of the Church, celebrating the abundance of gifts that God has given us. I am a firm believer that God has given us everything that we need to make God's Kingdom present in the northwest corridor of the county. But what should that look like? We draw all our strength from the Resurrection but what do we do with all this grace? The very last words uttered by the priest or Deacon at the end of every Liturgy is a command to 'go'! We do not take and eat and stay...we are nourished and then sent. Sent to do what? To give freely what we have received freely...nourishment, forgiveness, compassion, and this capacity to invite all peoples to the table. Jesus says, 'When I have been raised, I will draw all to myself'. Not some but all. So, we should go out and celebrate the love that our God has for us and do it joyfully!

We live in a post-pandemic world, and we are still learning how this pandemic has impacted our daily lives. The routines that we took for granted were turned upside down and I believe people are still struggling with how to get their feet back underneath them. Part of our role as disciple of the Christ is to help people come back and invite new folks in. in my own life, when I get out of my routine (especially in my workout) I find it difficult to get back in the groove. All the while I know I should be getting back to the gym, and I know it's good for me, but I struggle. I think it's the same with people who get out of the routine of going to church. They know they should, and they know its good for them but its just really hard to get back into a rhythm. Part of this Easter season should be for us to actively reach out to those folks who used to sit next to you and invite them back...not just once but every week and let's make their way back smooth and easy. Those gifts given to the Church on that first Pentecost are meant for everybody and we are not whole unless everybody is here. Let's have a great and fruitful Easter season and bring our brothers and sister back home.

## Help Feed Hungry Brockport Students

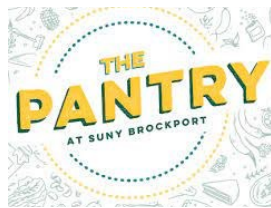

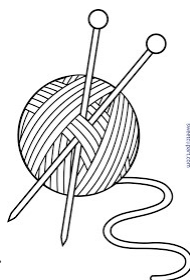


## Prayer Shawl Ministry

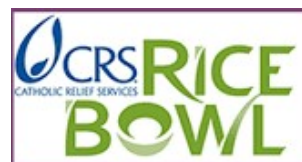
